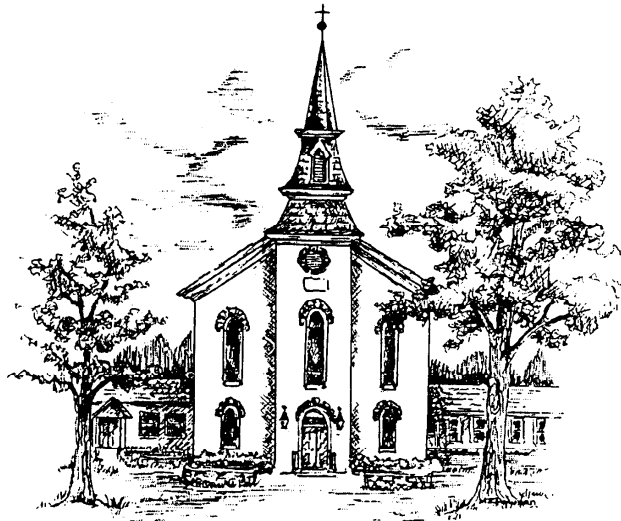

From Pastor Tony



“For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death until he comes.” (1 Corinthians 11:26)

As I am on sabbatical, I will miss gathering with you for the celebration of World Wide Communion on Sunday, October 2nd. This will be the first time in thirty-seven years of ministry that I will not be celebrating this special communion with the congregation I serve. It’s a different experience for me.

But, it will be a wonderful time for you! Rev. William Worley, the Conference Minister of the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference will be here to share in the communion service. He will share the ways in which our support of the church’s mission through the conference and beyond helps to change lives. And, he will be here to conduct the communion service, where we will remember the sacrifice Jesus made of each of us.

The truly wonderful aspect of this communion, though I will not be with you physically, is that I will be sharing the communion with other Christians in Germany. Indeed, the meaning of World Wide Communion will be something we both experience, you in Worcester and me in Germany, but both of us partaking of the bread and wine. So, come to celebrate joyfully this year. Come to the communion knowing that World Wide Communion is more than just a slogan; it’s a reality we experience together. May that bring deeper meaning to the celebration of October 2nd for each of us!
