


THE JEWELRY BOOTH volunteers found a piece of history at our annual Christmas Bazaar. In a vintage box from the Krementz Jewelry Company, newspaper clippings were found from 1953. It so happens that the item must have been a 25th anniversary gift to Elia Latshaw Heebner from her husband Russell Heebner. Both are buried in the church cemetery, and the article mentioned their daughter, Barbara Lee, who was a senior at Lansdale High School. Barbara Lee Heebner Wenner was just buried this year next to her parents. Mrs. Heebner had died in 1989.

The jewelry volunteers returned the item to Bill Wenner of Lansdale, widower of Barbara. The necklace in its box was in pristine condition and had been in the possession of the committee for more than 5 years, and was put out for sale at all the bazaars and also taken to a few jewelry conventions in Rhode Island. No one ever offered to buy it for the \$15 price. **This sure seems like a Christmas Miracle to us!** 

Mr. Wenner offered the \$15 for the item, but it was refused and presented to the family as a gift from Wentz's UCC.
